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"Ben Hill to Join Regional Transit on July 1"

Ben Hill County Public Transit will soon be seeing some changes. Effective July 1, Ben Hill County Public Transit will be joining Southern Georgia Regional Commission (SGRC) Regional Transit. Current riders are likely not to notice much change in the service except for a new name on the vehicles and a new phone number to schedule trips.

SGRC Regional Transit began in 2021 when several individual county-operated systems joined together with the SGRC to operate public transit services throughout a 14-county region. The SGRC, in partnership with the Georgia Department of Transportation and MIDS Transportation, Inc., administers the service.

Residents of Ben Hill County will be able to call 1-855-360-7475 at least 24-hours in advance to schedule a trip for any purpose throughout the region. Riders can also download the "Let's Ride" App for their smart phones to schedule rides as well. For residents of Ben Hill County that are over the age of 60, they can schedule free transportation through the Ben Hill County Senior Center at (229) 426-5085. Residents who are Medicaid clients may also receive free transportation, and can schedule transportation by calling 1-888-224-7985.

SGRC Regional Transit creates vital connections between people, jobs, shopping, healthcare, social opportunities, and community services. This is an exciting venture for our region and we are proud to share information that is relevant to the roll-out of public transit with you.
